Trails End Monument - This monument park features an 1870s cattle car, water tower, windmill, locomotive and sculpture of a cowboy herding longhorn cattle commemorates and celebrates the bravery and resolve of the early settlers, cowboys and railroaders who made the Sedalia Trail part of the greatest animal migration in history.



Bothwell Lodge – With a commanding view from atop a bluff, the Bothwell Lodge was built from 1897 to 1928 by lawyer John Homer Bothwell as a recreational lodge and summer home for himself and friends. Built in an eclectic style, the 31-room, 12,000 square foot lodge is built atop two natural caves which afford a source of natural air conditioning in the summer.



Katy Trail Depot – Built in 1896 as a railroad station, the Katy Depot serves as Sedalia's official welcome center with a museum that give the complete story of the town of Sedalia. The Depot also serves as a trailhead for the Katy Trail and has a bicycle sales and repair shop.
